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REGULAR BOARD MEETING CONTINUED

Principal Jeff Determan gave an update of the upcoming school calendar. February 16th is small group music contest in Chamberlain. Girls' and boys' basketball regular season ends February 18th. Wrestling regions will now be in Wagner on February 19th. There is no school on February 21st for President's Day. Gregory is hosting the Missouri Valley Spelling Bee on February 23rd. There will be no school for grades BK-5 on the day of the spelling bee. The individual state wrestling tournament is February 24th and 25th in Sioux Falls, with the state team tournament on February 26th. The end of the third quarter is March 4th. On March 7th, Black Hills State University will be presenting science presentations to the school and SDMEA Elementary Choir will be at the auditorium. There is no school on March 10th and 11th for spring break.

Superintendent Anderson reported that Mr. and Mrs. Opp represented Gregory very well in Brookings with the elementary honor choir and 6th grade band. Anderson is working on a Title I desk audit. There has been communication about the new video entry system to the school that is to be paid with the homeland security grant that was received and the hope is to have it installed in April. The school will be receiving supply chain assistance funding for the food service program. This is to be used for non-processed foods. For the summer food program, the school will be seeing if food can be served out the door due to the construction project that will be in the elementary. There are four busses not in operation due to issues. Two activity busses are being used for routes. At the Mid-Central Cooperative meeting, the board approved that repairs and updates to the building will go against the cost of the purchase of the building. CORE Educational Cooperative is looking to hire an assistant director as the current director is looking to retire in the future. A grant was received by CORE for the development an 18-21 year olds program. With this grant, a transition program could be started.

Jason Frasch stated there were no major updates with the state legislature.

Old Business:

The board discussed the auditorium walk through meeting in conjunction with the city.

New Business:

It was moved by Bolander and seconded by Hull for consideration and approval of elementary center corridor remodel and new building construction of locker rooms and wellness center.

It was moved by Hull and seconded by Schweigert to approve consideration of administrative contracts for Jeff Determan, PK-12 principal, Kevin Myrmoe, business manager, and Julie Anshutz, technology coordinator. Yes: All present. Motion carried.

It was moved by Schweigert and seconded by Frasch to approve hiring of Kathryn Lytle, food service employee, at a rate of \$14.00/hour for the 2021/22 school year. Yes: All present. Motion carried.

It was moved by Frasch and seconded by Schweigert to approve the school district intent to not participate in softball as a sanctioned sport of the SDHSAA. Yes: All present. Motion carried.

It was moved by Hull and seconded by Bolander to adjourn the board meeting at 6:54 pm. Yes: All present. Motion carried.
